How can I sign up for a meal plan?

To sign up for a meal plan, visit the Finance and Business Office in the Hayfield House.

A meal plan contract must be signed and returned to the Finance and Business Office in order to be posted on your student account. After the first day of class, all meal plan contracts must be paid for in advance by cash or check.

What does the meal Plan include?

Meal plan members receive a 65% discount off of prepared food items. Some items do not receive a discount, such as pre-packaged or vendor products; however, dining dollars can be used to purchase these products.

Do I need to purchase a Meal Plan for both semesters?

Wilkes-Barre Campus is one of a few Commonwealth Campuses where students are not required to purchase a Campus Meal Plan. However, students can elect to purchase a meal plan for only one semester or for both semesters if they wish.

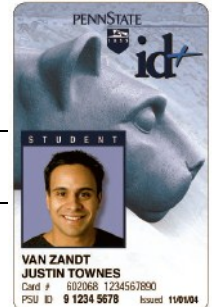
If you have leftover dining dollars from fall semester, the funds will carry over to spring semester only if you have purchased a new meal plan within the first two weeks of spring semester. If you do not purchase another plan by the end of the second week of spring semester, any leftover dining dollars from fall will be forfeited. Leftover dining dollars do not carry over from spring semester and are forfeited.

Can I add dining dollars?

You can add dining dollars to your meal plan at any time online using a MasterCard or Visa at www.idonline.psu.edu. To pay with cash or check, visit a cashier's station or the Finance and Business Office in Hayfield House.

The Penn State id+ Card is used for multiple purposes - accessing the meal plan & LionCash+, identification, newspaper machines (free of charge), as well as many other purposes. **The id+ Card is the official ID for Penn State, and students must carry it with them at all times. The replacement cost for a lost ID is \$15.00.**

What is LionCash+?

LionCash+ is an online, prepaid flexible spending account accessed by the Penn State id+ Card. Paying with LionCash+ gets you 10% off of selected items. Deposit money and enjoy the convenience of making purchases on-campus at the Hickory Court Café, Reese Cyber Café, and the PSU WB Bookstore. No worry about having the right amount of cash!

How The Plan Works

Meal plan accounts are accessed via the Penn State id+ Card. When you purchase a meal plan, funds are deposited into your new account. Each time you visit a dining facility operated by Penn State Housing and Food Services, simply present your id+ Card to the cashier, who will swipe the card through a reader. The reader will access your account, deduct the proper purchase amount, and display your new account balance.

Plan Costs and Savings

Meal Plan	Dining Dollars	+ Base Cost	=Total
Level I	\$565	\$1,275	\$1,840

Rates are per semester for the 2011–2012 academic year.

In the Hickory Court Café, the price for menu items includes a base cost, as well as the actual food cost. As a meal plan member, you have paid the base cost up front for the entire semester. To compensate for the base cost, your meals will be discounted approximately 65 percent off the cash price on most food and beverage purchases.

For Example: if the entrée for the day is meatloaf, mashed potatoes and corn and the cash price is \$5.00...

If Campus Meal Plan, you pay \$1.75.

If using LionCash, \$4.50 (10% discount).

Other Campuses: As a meal plan member, you can also save at the other cash operations operated by Penn State Housing and Food Services.

Purchasing a Plan

You may purchase a plan using the downloadable Contract Card. Submit the card to the Finance and Business Office. The cost will be charged to your Bursar account (semester bill), unless you mail the Contract Card with a check made payable to The Pennsylvania State University.

When you purchase the meal plan, you must do so for an entire semester. Meal plans are binding for the semester and balances are not refundable. If you withdraw from the University, the remainder of the dining dollars and a percentage of the base cost (based on University refund chart) will be credited to your Bursar account. A meal plan cannot be transferred or assigned to another individual.
